


How to Choose the Right Car Seat



Michigan Law requires the following:

- Children younger than age 4 must ride in a car seat in the back seat of the vehicle unless
 - The vehicle has no back seat—your child may ride in front.
 - The rear of the vehicle is occupied by other children under 4—your child may ride in front.
 - In the event of either of the above, the front passenger airbag <u>MUST</u> be turned off.
- All children must be buckled in a car seat or booster seat until they are age 8 or have reached a height of at least 4'9."
- Children age 8 and over must be placed in an age and weight appropriate car seat if the vehicle's seat belt does not fit properly.
- All children ages 12 and under must ride in the back seat.
